PROVIDENCE (Rhode Island) March 15.

This markenvre, it is supposed, was intended to make the appearance of a reinforcement from Forope, and which the Tories have industriously reported to be real.

By the last advices from France, we learn that ARTHUR Lux, efq; late of London, who is appointed by the United States to act in concert with Dr. Franklin, was arrived at that court, where he with the doctor were received and treated with all the respect shown to Furopean ambaffadours, and that they have already negotiated a loan of two millions of livres for and on account of the United States.
